PhD students in good academic and job performance standing receive a five-year funding commitment from the Department of Biostatistics in the form of RA or TA positions paid at the rates estimated above, as well as GAIP health insurance. Non-Residents qualify for Resident Tuition rates as part of this support package; the Resident tuition rate is used above.

Traing Grant (TG) appointments may be awarded to a very small number of students. This is done on a case-by-case basis and is subject to availability of TG openings. Students receive a high salary rate, but are required at the beginning of each quarter to pay 40% of the amount listed on the "Tuition paid by UW" line. The net compensation to student is approxiamtely the same you see above (within \$500).
